CAMPBELL MUSIC – A CELEBRATION!

Did You Know...

Campbell Collegiate dedicated our April 2018 Senior Music Tour to the Humboldt Broncos, and received Top Awards at Anaheim Heritage Festival, and performed and recorded at Disneyland! On April 12-17, 2018 Senior Music Students from Campbell Collegiate representing six senior Campbell performing ensembles travelled to Anaheim California to participate in the Anaheim Heritage Festival and perform at Disneyland.

Each of our students wore green and yellow ribbons on their jackets as we departed Regina to show our support for the Humboldt Bronco organization and continued to wear them at each performance. We dedicated each performance on our tour to the memory of those lost. Countless numbers of people from our WestJet flight attendants to the staff at Disney expressed their condolences and care and concern for our province and the families involved.

The Anaheim Heritage Festival is an International Music Festival that attracts high school music programs from across North America. Over 2000 students were involved! Besides receiving silver plaques for marks received in Wind Ensemble, Senior Concert Band, and Vocal Jazz and gold plaques for marks received in Jazz Band, Senior Voices and Chamber Choir - **Campbell Collegiate is pleased to announce that the Campbell Music Ensembles received the following top awards at the Awards Ceremony held in the Fantasyland Theatre at Disneyland including the top award given at the Festival:**

Campbell Chamber Choir – Invitation to perform at the Festival of Gold at Carnegie Hall in New York
Campbell Chamber Choir – Adjudicator's Award Trophy (highest mark attained in Choral or Band at the Festival)
Campbell Chamber Choir – Most Outstanding Choral Group Trophy
Campbell Senior Voices – Invitation to perform at the Festival of Gold at Carnegie Hall in New York

The most meaningful award that we received was the following as it recognized the entire music program:

Campbell Music Program – Festival Sweepstakes Award Trophy (awarded to the school that has the highest combined score at the Festival including both choral and band ensembles)

The magical part of the experience is not receiving the awards and accolades – but rather witnessing the strength of character, which these students possess. From the very first day of our tour to the last gathering in Calgary before our last flight home on April 17 – our students displayed grace, humility and joy! Just before we boarded the flight home – the students had the privilege of sharing their African Folk Songs with other passengers waiting for the plane – making a positive difference in other people's lives. The entire tour was an unforgettable experience! We were reminded over and over how important it is to live in the moment. Music is a gift that is meant to be shared.

After becoming the first public high school from Western Canada to receive 1st Place at the 2017 National Choral Festival, the Chamber Choir received the Gallagher Award in June 2018 at the Provincial Music Festival for the tenth year in a row which is the highest choral award at the Provincial Music Festival. The choir was also chosen for the tenth consecutive year to represent the Province of Saskatchewan at the 2018 National Choral Festival to be held in Sackville New Brunswick in August. The National Choral Festival Competition includes choirs representing every province and territory who have been selected from over 231 local festivals across Canada. Besides being recognized at the National Finals for the past nine years, The Chamber Choir has been chosen to present a Showcase Concert at the Canadian Rocky Mountain Festival held at the Banff Centre for the Fine Arts on three occasions, and has performed at the Opening of the Saskatchewan Legislature on four separate occasions.

Campbell has the largest curricular jazz program in the province with three vocal jazz ensembles, and four jazz band ensembles at the high school. In addition, 2 jazz bands are offered at the elementary level. This extensive program allows students of all ages and abilities the opportunity to enrich their education by learning a second language - jazz!

Campbell is the only public high school in the province to offer a curricular string orchestra program. The string orchestra, going into its fifth year, is comprised of an extraordinary group of students who love to play string instruments. With the recent addition of other instruments, this ensemble has now expanded into a symphony orchestra.

The Campbell Area Elementary Band Program plays an integral role in the transition of students from elementary to high school. The elementary band program offers extensive opportunities including: Grade 6 Band, Grade 7 Band, Grade 8 Band, Jazz Band, Junior Winds and the Curiosity Club for students who would like to try a second or third instrument. Grant Road, Massey, McVeety, Dr. A.E. Perry, Hawrylak, Jack MacKenzie, Wilfrid Walker, and Wilfred Hunt Schools are all part of the wonderful elementary band program this year. All students will participate in festivals and performances around the city.

Campbell has the largest Concert Band and Choral program in the province! As a performance based program, the Campbell Music Department is committed to planning educational music tours that are rewarding and fulfilling for all students. This past April, the Senior Music Ensembles traveled to Anaheim where they received the top awards at the Anaheim Heritage Festival and recorded sound tracks in Disney Studios. The Intermediate Ensembles performed in Winnipeg in March and the Junior Ensembles participated in a wonderful tour to Red Deer in May where they performed at local venues, received clinics at and performed in the Palliative Care Unit at the Red Deer Hospital.
