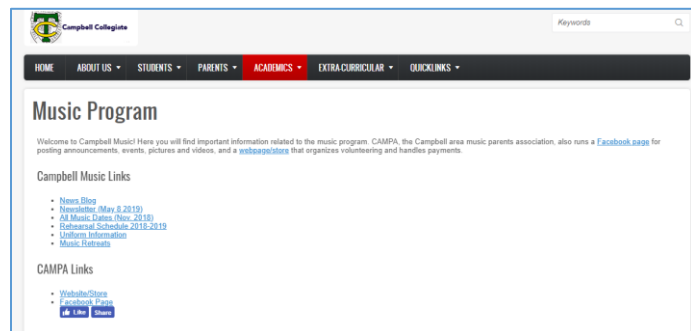

# **CAMPBELL MUSIC – A CELEBRATION!**

## ***Did You Know...***

**The Campbell Area Elementary Band Program plays an integral role** in the transition of students from elementary to high school. It offers extensive opportunities including: Grade 6 Band, Grade 7 Band, Grade 8 Band, Jazz Bands, and the Junior Winds. Grant Road, Massey, McVeety, Dr. A.E. Perry, Hawrylak, Jack MacKenzie, Wilfrid Walker, and Wilfred Hunt Schools are all part of the wonderful elementary band program this year. These students, under the direction of Kathy Anderson, Travis Wilkinson, Scott Adelman, Bev Brander, and Tanya Tazzioli come to Campbell throughout the week for small and large ensemble classes, which aids in their “transition to high school” process. Last spring, our **Grade 8 Bands** had a very successful tour to Saskatoon, and the **Grade 7 Band** participated in the Moose Jaw Band Festival.

**Campbell has the largest Concert Band and Choral program in the province!** As a performance based program, the Campbell Music Department is committed to planning educational music tours that are rewarding and fulfilling for all students.

The **Grade 9 Ensembles** participated in a wonderful tour to Red Deer in May where they performed at schools in Rosetown and Red Deer, and community venues including an incomparable performance in the Meditation Garden at the Red Deer Hospital. The band had an opportunity to partake in a clinic with Doug Ward.

The **Intermediate Ensembles** traveled to Winnipeg in March, with a stop at the University of Brandon for band and choir clinics. While in Winnipeg, the students spent time with our music friends at Daniel McIntyre Collegiate, performed at Bairdmore Elementary School, and toured the Canadian Museum for Human Rights

All six **Senior Ensembles** performed this year at the Canadian Rocky Mountain Festival at the Banff Centre for Arts and Creativity. The Grade 11/12 Concert Band, Senior Voices, Jazz Band 1, Vocal Jazz 1, Wind Ensemble, and Chamber Choir all provided outstanding performances and benefited from the expertise of internationally-renowned clinicians. The students also had the opportunity to attend a multitude of other festival participants’ performances, several showcase concerts featuring exemplary ensembles (including our own Chamber Choir!), and special festival concerts by the University of Calgary Wind Ensemble and internationally-acclaimed Swingle Singers. A Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra Breathing Gym and Percussion Master Class rounded out this amazing opportunity to partake in the most extensive music festival experience in Western Canada.

In addition to our concerts at Campbell Auditorium, First Nations University, and Westminster United Church, our ensembles have had the honour of performing at many community events throughout the year. This includes the Chamber Choir performances at the Opening of the Saskatchewan Legislative Assembly Ceremony, the Saskatchewan Police and Peace Officers Memorial, Candlelight Christmas Concerts with the Regina Symphony Orchestra, as well as other community events and venues. In June 2019, the Chamber Choir received the Gallagher Award, which is the highest choral award at the Provincial Music Festival, for the eleventh year in a row, and was chosen for the eleventh consecutive year to represent the Province of Saskatchewan at the 2019 National Choral Festival. The Wind Ensemble also had the honour of performing at the Brandt Centre Remembrance Day Program, the Grade 9 Choir participated in the Singing for Life Community Choral Concert, and Jazz Band 1 performed at the Regina Jazz Festival in June.

With a large enthusiastic group consisting of students in Grades 9-12, this performance-based class is looking forward to presenting our Fall Production. ### **HIGH SCHOOL MUSIC RETREATS**

**Music retreats are essential elements of the music program.** An important part of being a choir or band member is being a team player. The retreats provide each choir and band with the opportunity to work together in extended rehearsals, technique sessions and other sessions that enhance the team building process. The Retreat Participation Fee is included in the registration fee (except for the Chamber Choir Retreat). The retreats are held at Living Hope Alliance Church (or, for Chamber Choir, at Dallas Valley). Music Students are expected to have made arrangements in their schedules in order to accommodate the retreats, which are a part of the curriculum. **It is essential that all members of the bands and choirs attend their respective retreats, as it requires a complete group effort in order to ensure success.**

## **HIGH SCHOOL MUSIC FEE COLLECTION (through the Campbell Office!)**

Campbell Collegiate will collect all high school music class fees directly from music families for students enrolled in high school music credit courses along with fees for their other courses. These fees include the annual registration fee for class consumables, Noon Choir/Band Fall Retreat fees, and the Grade 9 Uniform T-Shirt. *These fees are used exclusively in the Campbell Music Program.* This allows the school to consistently collect all fees for elective credit classes, and allows CAMPA to focus on fundraising for all music students at Campbell to continue to be enriched through clinic opportunities, elementary/secondary transition activities, and educationally-based performance tours.

**The school fee structure for Grade 9** as indicated on the school fee sheet is as follows:

- Musical Theatre 9 (consumables) \$40.00
- Noon Choir 9 (consumables, uniform T-Shirt and Fall Retreat) \$70.00
- Noon Band 9 (consumables, uniform T-Shirt and Fall Retreat) \$70.00
- **Combined Choir & Band 9: if your child is enrolled in both choir and band the cost is only \$90.00**

The school fee structure for Grades 10/11/12 as indicated on the school fee sheet is:

- Musical Theatre 10/20/30 (consumables) \$40.00
- Noon Choir 10/20/30 (consumables, and Fall Retreat) \$60.00
- Noon Band 10/20/30 (consumables and Fall Retreat) \$60.00
- **Combined Noon Choir & Band 10/20/30: if your child is enrolled in both, the cost is only \$80.00**

## **POLICE INFORMATION CHECKS FOR VOLUNTEERS**

As per Regina Public school board policy, anyone who volunteers at school related activity and has direct contact with students is required to have a police information check completed by the Regina Police Service for Regina residents, and local RCMP detachment for those living outside city limits, and submitted to the school office. This would include but not be limited to chaperoning music tours and retreats, uniform volunteers, etc. Online application forms are now available.
